# Summary

A PhD (Psychology UQ 1997) was the starting point of about 20 years of stats/methods work. I tutored on statistical topics and provided assistance with statistics privately while a PhD student. I went on to work for the Education Faculty, Mt Gravatt campus, Griffith University for some 10 years (1999-2009), advising and assisting RHD students and staff. I managed a university wide research methods forum during this time. I went on to work in similar capacity for a Health Research Centre and am now in a similar role for the broader community of RHD students across Griffith University (courtesy of the Griffith Research Student School).

I have also worked for about 15 years convening and teaching courses and workshops in quantitative and qualitative research methods and design, demonstrating the use of statistical software, and providing methodological and statistical advice in settings that include the ARC, Griffith University, QUT, the University of New England, and the University of Tasmania.

As stated above, I've worked as a private consultant on projects and with academics and others since the period in which I was completing my own PhD. Past clients include the Australian Council of Deans of Education, Indigenous Researchers' Network (Griffith University), Micah Projects (courtesy of Partnering Works), Townsville GP network, BoysTown, Sharjah Department of Civil Aviation, Bahrain Labour Fund, Queensland Alliance for Mental Health, TechWrite Inc. USA, Queensland Education, AHURI, QuickSmart CRC, and Guides Australia.

I've also worked as an associate at the Eidos Institute (http://www.eidos.org.au/) from about 2007onwards on EIDOS Institute projects in Australia and the Middle East, including 12 months as chief advisor tender and panel submissions at Eidos, identifying tender opportunities, writing tender proposals, and contributing to corporate publications.

I have a particular interest in designing, developing, and analysing surveys (though most clients are most interested in my capacity to analyse and write reports based on those analyses). Other statistical interests include the use of SPSS Optimal Scaling to develop demographic profiles, AMOS to do structural equation modelling, Winsteps to do Rasch item analysis, and Leximancer (http://www.leximancer.com/) to do automated text analysis.
